From our COM Moderator

Dear Broadmoor Presbyterian Church community,

My name is Don Hammond, and I've been working with your session as the Committee on Ministry (COM) liaison since Rev. Katheryn Pyke and her husband Richard announced their decision to move at the end of last year. I wanted to take a moment to share some updates on our work together.

The Committee on Ministry is a committee of the Presbytery of San Francisco that supports congregations during times of transition. For your church, this began with Rev. Pyke's need to care for her family. As the pastor of a church, the role is broad, encompassing leading worship, pastoral care, and administrative functions, such as moderating the session. When Rev. Pyke was unable to perform these duties, I was appointed as the moderator. Since November last year, I've met with your session monthly to moderate meetings, provide guidance on the search for a new pastor, and assist in identifying pulpit supply preachers and ordained or commissioned

pastors to preside at the Communion table once a month.

I've been the co-chair of the COM since 2019. Before that, I served on COMs for the Presbyteries of Long Island and Boston. In my own ministry, I've been an intentional transitional pastor, gaining extensive experience working with churches in transition.

Because I pastor a congregation, I can't join your community for worship on Sunday mornings. However, I wanted to share that I'm meeting with your session elders, who provide me with insights into the worship life and mission of your community. Your session has been a pleasure to work with. The meetings are well-organized, with your elders and Martha diligently reporting on your various committees and dedicated to serving you and the church. Additionally, the session meetings are relatively short, which is unusual for Presbyterians (!). I'm also collaborating with your Mission Study team to develop a new Mission Study Report. This process is crucial for congregations embarking on pastoral searches. The report, modeled on the one you did in 2018, will help focus the vision and needs for the upcoming season of ministry at Broadmoor.

If you have any questions for the session or me, please feel free to reach out via email. In the meantime, know that your elders are doing an excellent job, and the COM is committed to supporting you all.

Board Of Deacons

The Deacons have met regularly either in person or via Zoom. We continue to make calls, send cards and pray for those that cannot be with us. David Pajarit volunteered to be on the Mission Study Committee and Geraldine Thompson will help Ruth Cruz with cards when needed. Thank you.



The Deacons filled pulpit supply on July 20th with a

wonderfully planned hymn service where a Deacon told a story about their favorite hymn before it was sung and David Pajarin's solo was a hit. It was an awesome service singing 'inside-the-box.'

Building & Grounds

The team last met on May 11th and a motion was made and approved to tent and treat the building at a cost not to exceed \$25K and to be scheduled during the 3rd quarter 2025. In June, a realtor friend of Rich Murray's inspected the exterior and interior of the building and spot treated the one termite prone area (on the 3rd floor) at a fraction of the estimated cost from the pest control company, what a blessing! During this inspection it was also discovered that we have woodborne beetles nesting in our front red doors and some windows that need treatment in Tweedie Hall and plans are being made to treat these areas as well.

In late April, the first floor was flooded. O'Grady Plumbing was wonderful in replacing the kitchen water heater the same day. Thanks to Rich Murray and Dennis Shreve for helping with the clean up. A thermostat was replaced on the 2nd floor furnace. An area rug was placed at the chancel area to protect the fraying carpet. A water leak was found in Tweedie Hall coming from a 2nd floor daycare area sink. Thank you Peninsula Family Service for taking care of this repair. The blinds in the Calvin Room and in both 3rd floor classrooms were replaced, a 1st floor restroom sink P-trap was replaced and graphite was sprayed on all the locks around the

church, thank you Dennis Shreve. Rich Murray repaired a window in the daycare area, replaced a filter in a 3rd floor toilet and has been monitoring the sprinklers, Thanks Rich!



Tweedie Hall was rented to the Peninsula Family Service Youth Program for

8 weeks. They built a storage shed! See the attached article.

The team has met regularly, and have been assisting the Worship and Mission Committees when needed. The Book review of LOOKING UP by Courtney Ellis was well received. We had a successful Book Swap during coffee fellowship in May. Penny Manis continues to put together a Minute for History celebrating 75 years. The final M4H ended on August 3rd. Thanks Penny! 

Mission Study Committee

On behalf of the Mission Study Team Jean Aro, Penny Manis, David Pajarit and Martha Espinosa, we would like to provide an update on our progress. Since convening in early spring, our team has met biweekly to complete the important work required to move forward in calling a new pastor to Broadmoor.

As part of this process, the Presbytery of San Francisco requires a current Mission Study. Our previous study was completed in 2018, and much has changed since then—most notably, the way our church has embraced Zoom for worship and meetings due to the pandemic. We have taken care to update all relevant data and reflect the ways in which Broadmoor now worships, fellowships, and serves together.

We have submitted the completed 2025 Mission Study to the Presbytery of San Francisco for review. And since, it has been forwarded to COM (Committee of Ministry) for their September review. Once it is approved, we will make copies available to the congregation, if you wish, and a Pastor Nominating Committee will be formed.

The team has done outstanding work throughout this process. I look forward to sharing the study with you soon and beginning the next steps in our journey toward calling a new pastor. Thank you for your continued prayers and support.

Building Skills, Building Futures: A Summer of Trades and Financial Empowerment



Every time a student picks up a hammer for the first time, I see a spark — a moment of curiosity that could turn into confidence. This summer, I had the privilege of guiding a group of YEEE (Youth Empowerment, Entrepreneurship & Employment) summer interns through hands-on construction training. What they built was more than just a shed.

Inside Broadmoor Presbyterian Church's Fellowship Hall in Daly City, we rolled out tape measures, chalked layout lines, and lifted walls together. For many students, this was their first time reading a floor plan, using power tools, or understanding what a solid day's work feels like. We framed walls with window and door openings and applied exterior sheathing. Along the way, students learned how to problem-solve, collaborate, and take pride in craftsmanship.


But we didn't stop there. This summer, students also took part in a financial literacy class taught by Carlos and Jen from Peninsula Family Service — an essential piece of the bigger picture. They covered budgeting, saving, and smart decision-making with money. Just like in the trades class, students were learning how to build something lasting — in this case, a foundation for financial independence.

What impressed me most was their drive. They asked questions. They corrected their mistakes. They came back the next day ready to do more. That's what this program is about — not just teaching carpentry or money skills, but helping young people discover their ability to learn, lead, and contribute.

This was a paid internship, and the professionalism they showed proved they earned every cent. It was more than a job. It was a glimpse into a future where they can thrive — where their hands build homes, their minds manage money, and their hearts build community.

Thanks to the support from Peninsula Family Service, San Mateo County Office of Education, the Youth Leadership Institute, and Broadmoor Presbyterian Church, we were able to transform a simple project into a life-changing experience.
